 - have access to information on such issues as sustainability, quality and the workforce
 - are able to influence strategic plans

at borough, sub-regional and cross-London level

- are supported to help families with home learning

- **Equality** for disadvantaged groups is promoted at all levels

It provides:

Exchange

An opportunity to share experiences and best practice, across the age range, and across the private, voluntary, independent (PVI) and maintained sectors, through

- an annual London childcare providers forum and survey
- a London e-bulletin covering news, events and services
- free workshops and seminars
- information on home learning, on the Daycare Trust website.

Expertise

- Daycare Trust’s knowledge and perspective, as the leading childcare campaigning charity.
- The input of an expert Advisory Board, which can also take forward issues within their respective organizations: Children’s Workforce Development Council, Department for Children, Schools and Families, Family and Parenting Institute, Government Office for London, Greater London Authority, Greater London Enterprise, London Councils, London Development Agency and Pre-school Learning Alliance.

- The input of a London Childcare Providers Consultative Committee which identifies key issues, and helps engage members in project activities: National Childminding Association, National Day Nurseries Association, 4Children, Pre-school Learning Alliance, London Early Years Foundation and several local authorities.
- The Daycare Trust information line.

Influence

- The feeding in of key concerns and proposals to London boroughs, the Department for Children, Schools and Families, London MPs, London councillors and other key players.
- Dissemination of the annual London childcare providers survey results and other project data.
